## Humanoid Service Robots: Challenges and Opportunities in Healthcare"

- During the pandemic humanoids were used in several countries to help health care staff in the frontline with easier tasks in order to reduce their contact with patients infected with the virus.

It is estimated that robots can do at least 20 % of nurses work in hospital and longterm elderly care. During the pandemic humanoids were deployed to do easy tasks like carry food and medicine to infected patients, taking the temperature and fill up the void in isolated wards.

- Some humanoids were also deployed to ease out the loneliness during social distancing for elderly, and in some cases the elderly became confused and felt exhausted since they started to expect more human traits from the humanoids.

During her seminar Selcen would like to discuss both challenges and opportunities in using humanoids within health care and elderly care.
